Christmas Treasure



What is the greatest treasure you own? Is it a mansion? A car? A blue or pink diamond?

The bible tells us that all these things are temporal and will all pass away: "So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal" (2 Cor 4:18). In the Parables of the Hidden Treasure and the Pearl – Jesus teaches that "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. We are closely following Royal Commission findings as they are published, and as a result, you may have received a call from us recently regarding the keypad locks that are installed for resident and staff safety / security. If you have any queries or concerns about this system (or anything else at the facility), please do not hesitate to contact us.

If you are unsure of their needs, please check with care staff beforehand. Also, we know that many people like to share yummy Christmas goodies with one another!
