We are also eagerly awaiting the arrival of several new residents in our retirement villages. We always look forward to welcoming new residents and trust they will enjoy settling in to the Outlook Christian Living community.



For those who do not know me, I am married to Jenny and have two sons Shane (26), who married Mareshah a year ago, and Ryan (22) who still lives with us. I had the privilege to be the Pastor of the Christian Reformed Church of Casey for the past eleven and a half years. I enjoy playing cricket, coaching soccer, gardening and relaxing at the beach!

In keeping with our association's Christian heritage, CEO Jacques asked me to consider starting a fortnightly gathering in the aged care home to learn from God's Word and discuss how we can keep growing in our Christian faith. This gathering is called **G.I.F.T.** (**Growing In Faith Together**) because our Christian faith is God's gracious GIFT to us (Ephesians 2:8-9). We seek to grow in our faith because Jesus said He is the Vine and we are the branches, we are to remain in Him and bear much fruit (John 15).

G.I.F.T. alternates with the very popular hymn singing led by my Dad, Ps Crosbie and Aunty Ishbelle Poppenbeck. Henni Burggraaf also continues to lead a Faith Stories discussion each month. Every week, we have God's word shared and sung in various ways in the aged care home. This complements the Dandenong Christian Reformed Church's weekly church gathering and 24/7 songs of praise that is streamed throughout Outlook Gardens. Many are deeply encouraged from these faith growing events.
