### Encouragement from our Pastoral Care Coordinator

I have the privilege to care for, encourage and listen to our residents, many of whom have lost their lifelong companion and struggle with loneliness. They miss their loved one, particularly in the evenings as there is no one with whom to share about their day. Others do not have regular visitors to talk to, reminisce about yesteryear and to listen to them. It is not nice being lonely.

God's intention is for us not to be alone. He created us to have fellowship with Him and others.

He said to Adam in the Garden of Eden: "It is not good that man should be alone", and created Eve to be his helper (Genesis 2:18). King Solomon also said, "Two are better than one" (Ecclesiastes 4:9).

When you feel lonely, I encourage you firstly to **be in relationship with Jesus, our faithful Friend** who said, "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). Jesus demonstrated this by sacrificing His life at Calvary so that we could be His friends.

Jesus is our true Friend who is with us 24/7 through the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit. He is our Comforter and Counsellor! Let us go to Him when we are lonely, weary and heavy laden to find rest.



Secondly, I encourage you to ask the Lord to provide you with a trusted person or group whom you can be friend. For some of us this is easy, whilst others struggle to open ourselves and trust others to maintain confidentiality. However the scriptures below share some wonderful benefits of having and being friends. Thirdly, having enjoyed the benefits of friends, as the scriptures below point out, we are to be warm, friendly and hospitable to others who stay in their homes

and rooms all by themselves. I have seen this in action in our retirement villages and aged care home with residents visiting others, welcoming new neighbours into their friendship circles and social activities, hosting them for coffee or a meal, invitations for Christmas lunch or New Year's Eve and making meals for them after hospital stays. Please keep this up! You are obeying the second greatest command by loving others in these ways. I receive lots of positive feedback on how our four sites are so welcoming and friendly, and I encourage you to continue!

The Bible says a lot about friends and how we are to love our neighbours. This is a good checklist for us:

A friend loves at all times (Proverbs 17:17) and forgives as the Lord forgave us (Colossians 3:12-14).

A friend encourages (1 Thessalonians 5:11), builds others up (Job 6:14) and is kind (Galatians 5:22).

A friend does not stir up conflict nor gossips (Proverbs 16:28).

Wounds from a friend can trusted (Proverbs 27:6).

Friends carry each other's burdens (Galatians 6:2).

A friend is hospitable and serves others (1 Peter 4:8-10).

A friend sharpens the other and holds each other accountable (Proverbs 27:17).
